kinetic energy (noun): energy an object or particle has because it is moving <u>Synonym:</u> energy in motion magnify (verb): to enlarge in fact or appearance <u>Synonym:</u> multiply, amplify, enhance

air resistance (noun): a force that opposes the motion of an object as it goes through the air

absorb (verb): to receive without giving back Synonym: consume, take in diameter (noun): a line segment through the center of a circle ending on the circumference Synonym: distance across a circle spokes (noun): small bars extending from the hub of a wheel to support the rim gear (noun): a toothed wheel overcome (verb): to gain an advantage or victory over Synonym: take over, defeat, conquer

**lever** (*noun*): a stiff bar for applying force at one point by effort at a second point and turning on the fulcrum

Synonym: shovel, paddle, broom; tools with handles

ratio (noun): the comparison in quantity, amount or size between two or more things

Synonym: proportion, rate, scale

activated (verb): to make active

Synonym: turn on, set in motion, start

treads (noun): the ridges or grooves on a tire that make contact with the road
